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**TOUR OVERVIEW**

Morocco's unique geographical location in North Africa, with shorelines on both the Atlantic Ocean and the Mediterranean Sea, between Europe, the Middle East, and the rest of Africa, makes it one of the oldest and most vibrant trading posts in the world. For Romans, Arabs, Imazighen, French, Portuguese, Spanish, and sub-Saharan Africans, it has long been a crossroads for the exchange of food, arts, ideas, and people. It is also a land of intricately designed cities, colorful villages, and stunning landscapes.

With expert guidance and exclusive access, participants will delve into this exotic nation to soak up its natural beauty and vibrant culture. Trip highlights include hands-on cooking lessons and demonstrations, behind-the-scenes exploration of cultural antiquities unique to Morocco, camel trekking through the Sahara Desert, exclusive entry into private venues and musical performances, enhanced tours of sites, public parks, and many surprises!

**ITINERARY**

**Day 1 February 14: Depart USA to Casablanca/Morocco**

Begin your travels today June 1 with a flight across the Atlantic to arrive in Casablanca, Morocco around 8:30 am and no later than 10:30am on June 2. Participants book their own flights. Suggest nonstop flights from the US to Casablanca, Morocco on Royal Air Maroc:

- From New York (JFK)
- From Washington DC, Dulles international airport (IAD)
- From Miami (MIA)

**Day 2 February 15: Casablanca/Fes**

Arrive at Mohammed V Airport in Casablanca, meet your tour guide, and transfer to our luxury van for a beautiful drive through diverse landscapes to the ancient city of Fes. (L,D)

**Day 3 February 16: Fes**

Morning departure for a guided tour to explore one of Morocco's most historic and important cities - Fes. The visit will take us to various areas including the Royal Palace, the Mellah (Jewish quarters), a panoramic view of the city, then into the medina ("old city") to see some of its many sections. Each section specializes certain

types of foods, wares, and handmade arts and crafts, such as embroidery, weaving, and ceramics. We will have an opportunity to see artisans making exquisite items using centuries-old traditional techniques. Of special interest are the ancient leather dyeing vats in the heart of the city. We will sample a wide variety of local cuisines.

Tonight, we have a special group dinner at a local restaurant specializing in authentic Moroccan cuisine with a show featuring a variety of musicians and dancers representing different areas and ethnic groups. As a special treat, we will enjoy a theatrical presentation of a Moroccan wedding ceremony with our group members participating to get very close to the culture, including dancing for all. (B,L,D)

#### **Day 4 February 17: Fes - Midelt**

After breakfast we will visit the beautiful public gardens of Jnan Sbil for a stroll through this former Royal Garden. We will then go to a family home and experience a special spiritual Sufi ceremony in the Fes medina. Afterward, we continue to Midelt, crossing the Cedar Forest. Overnight in Midelt. (B,L,D)

#### **Day 5 February 18: Midelt - Erfoud - Mezguida**

Drive south through the Ziz Valley to the Tafilalet Oasis/ Palm grove. We will make a stop in Erfoud to see and learn about fossils that this area is known for. Overnight at a family guest house. This evening you should pack a small bag (backpack or small soft bag) including bathing suit and change of clothes for one-night overnight the next day (B, L, D)

#### **Day 6 February 19 Thursday : Rissani - Desert camp**

Explore this area, including a visit to an adobe village then go to the nearby town of Rissani, a former hub for trans-Saharan trade to learn about spices, enjoy a presentation on different types of Amazigh (Berber) textiles and how they are used by locals. We will also learn about the meaning of motifs on these hand-woven and or embroidered textiles.

In the afternoon, we drive out into the desert until we reach the golden sand dunes. We go on a magical camel ride across the sand dunes for an overnight with dinner. Be prepared to join the drumming and dancing circle at our Saharan camp! (B, L, D)

#### **Day 7 February 20: Return from camp - Saharan Oasis - Mezguida**

After returning from our camel excursion, we will enjoy downtime by the pool. We will have a demonstration and learn how to make a local specialty of stuffed bread baked in the sand, as the nomads have done for centuries. The afternoon will be spent exploring the desert region including a Saharan oasis and gardens, witnessing how locals extract water from the dunes for drinking and irrigation using an ancient underground system called *khuttaras*. Our day will be topped with a visit to a local community to sip mint tea and experience their unique spiritual music and chanting. Overnight in Mezguida. (B,L,D)

#### **Day 8 February 21: Todra Gorge - Kalat M'Gouna**

Today's ride is full of unique scenes, such as the *khuttaras*, an ancient underground system of irrigation. Lunch en route. We will see the Todra Gorge (canyon) and a beautiful valley dotted with many villages, make stops to enjoy the views through this spectacular ride. We will notice the change in architecture and even the way people dress in this area. We will reach the mountain town of Kalat M'Gouna in the rose valley. Dinner & overnight. ( B, L, D)

#### **Day 9 February 22: Ouarzazate**

Today, we will have a treat and an amazing experience overlooking the lush valley and kasbahs. We will be introduced to a totally different style of music and dance unique to this region. Participants will have a chance to join the dance. Overnight in Ouarzazate (B, L, D)

#### **Day 10 February 23: Ouarzazate - Kasbah Ait Ben Haddou - Marrakech**

Ouarzazate is a town known for film production. Today we will cross the amazing High Atlas Mountains. The scenery in the mountains is striking and unique, as dozens of Amazigh (Berber) villages accented with terrace gardens can be seen. One of the highlights for today is the world heritage site Kasbah Ait Ben

Haddou. We will visit a women's cooperative that specializes in making famous Argan Oil. Overnight in Marrakech. (B,L,D)

**Day 11 February 24: Explore Marrakech**

We will explore Marrakech, including a lush hidden garden ("Le Jardins Secret"), created on the grounds of a historical site. We will visit the 19<sup>th</sup> century Bahia Palace, and the 11<sup>th</sup> century Koutoubia Mosque and gardens. We will then enter the lively souks ("markets") to experience its colors and its smells. (B,L,D)

**Day 12 February 25: Further Explore Marrakech**

We visit more of Marrakech, including a visit to the beautiful Jardin Secret located inside the medina. We will also enjoy a walk around the traditional markets. Our day ends with cocktails and sunset watching on roof tops of our Riad followed by dinner and an exclusive music and dance performance (B,L,D)

**Day 13 February 26: Anima Gardens - Essaouira**

Today, we leave Marrakech and visit Anima gardens before continuing to Essaouira. Essaouira is an historic small town on the Atlantic coast of Morocco, dating back to the middle ages. Originally named Mogador in the 1500's. it has been occupied by the Portuguese, Spanish, French. The present day city of Essaouira was built during the mid-18<sup>th</sup> century by king Mohammed III. (B, D)

**Day 14 February 27: Further exploration of Essaouira**

We will explore Essaouira markets within the ancient walls of the Essaouira Medina, streets, visit its fishing port, overlooks, watch artists make creative arts, and a possible optional session of hammam & massage (Moroccan bath) experience to end the trip with. (B,L,D)

**Day 15 February 28: Transfer to Casablanca Airport**

Transfer to Casablanca Mohammed V Airport to fly home. (B) **Bon Voyage!!**

Please bring all necessary medications with you. **Each participant must be covered by medical insurance that is valid overseas. Each participant must have trip cancellation and interruption insurance.**
